

Muir College Advising recommends that students starting in Winter who plan to attend community college in the Fall quarter enroll in 3 courses.

SUGGESTED COURSES TO TAKE DURING THE FALL QUARTER AT YOUR LOCAL COMMUNITY COLLEGE:

WRITING:

- If you have not satisfied the UC Entry Level Writing requirement, it is to your best advantage to enroll in a Basic English Composition course in order to satisfy that requirement before you arrive at UCSD. For more information on this requirement, please visit: <http://subjecta.ucsd.edu/>.

MATH:

- If you are considering a major that requires calculus (see: <http://mathtesting.ucsd.edu/majors.shtml>), you may want to take an appropriate math Calculus course, (depending on your level) in the Fall. To learn more about which level of Math is most appropriate for you to take, please visit: <http://mathtesting.ucsd.edu/about.shtml>.
- Please note that completion of a Pre-Calculus course at a community college will not automatically allow you to enroll in Calculus at UCSD; you will still be required to take the Math Placement Exam. However, it may be a great course to take to prepare you to take Calculus at UCSD.
- Keep in mind that a 3 or higher on any AP Calculus exam may clear you of at least 1 quarter of Calculus; refer to the AP chart at <http://provost.ucsd.edu/muir/advising/ap.htm>.
